SUPPORT OUR GIRL SCOUT TROOP

Girl Scout Troop 550, the troop that meets here at Oaklette, will be having a Pop-up Market On Saturday, April 6, 2024 From 12:00-3:00.



In the Old Testament, fire often symbolizes the presence of God's Spirit. For example, God called to Moses from a burning bush (Exodus 3:2-6) and defeated the prophets of Baal on Mount Carmel (1 Kings 18:30-39). In the New Testament, tongues of fire rested atop the believers gathered on Pentecost (Acts 2:3).

Some Christians have described a burning or current-like sensation when they encounter God. Methodism founder John Wesley said his heart was "strangely warmed" during worship. After such an encounter, people often feel compelled to share the Good News of Jesus. The flame of faith inside one believer can spark a revival of faith in others. As Charles Spurgeon said, "A burning heart will soon find for itself a flaming tongue."



The Second Sunday of Easter has been my favorite worship service for years. It started back in 2017, when I was at Lakehurst Naval Air Station for Annual Training with the reserves. Lakehurst conducts joint operations with Fort Dix and Maguire Air Force Base, and on the Second Sunday of Easter in 2017, I spoke at a chapel at Fort Dix. The Gospel for the Second Sunday of Easter is John 20:19-31, and I had my sermon ready to go. In this service, a layperson reads the scripture at the beginning. The lay reader that day was a member of the choir, and as she read the Gospel, I thought, "Why hadn't I heard that before?" When the time came to preach, I took my sermon outline, placed it on a music stand, and walked away from it. I told the congregation that I wouldn't be using my outline because I felt as if, starting with the reading of the Gospel, I was supposed to say something different. I don't know what I said, but I shut my eyes and spoke, and kept them shut until I was done speaking. Ever since, I've always looked forward to the Second Sunday after Easter, as I am now, and as we prepare for worship based on John 20:19-31.

This text inspired the use of "doubting Thomas," and that's unfortunate, because Thomas is no more doubting than any believer after the resurrection, and also because this text is jam-packed with scripture that pertains to all of us. Verses 21-23 alone read, "Again Jesus said, "Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you.' And with that he breathed on them and said, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone's sins, their sins are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven.'" Working with this text this week, I've wondered how the church has taught this and how we can study it. I've discussed this with other pastors and I look forward to getting your thoughts in Bible study Thursday and here on Sunday morning.

I'm also looking forward to our Breakthrough Prayer Initiative workshop, Saturday, April 20, 10 a.m.-noon. If you haven't already gotten a copy of *Flood Gates* by Sue Nilson Kibbey, please contact the church and we will get one to you. We've ordered enough copies for everyone and are asking everyone to read the second chapter on Breakthrough Prayer before the workshop. Please make sure you get a copy of the book as soon as possible, and please plan on attending the workshop. The intent is to pray for God to do what only God can do at Oaklette, and my feeling is that this may well take us back to John 20:21-23.
