Thanks to all who brought mittens, scarves and hats for the Mitten Tree. The children of College Park School will really benefit from the gifts.



I've made a few changes to the Blue Christmas service. I think some changes were needed. Among them, come Dec. 21, we'll be reading Psalm 23 in addition to Psalm 22. We'll also have a couple of recorded musical interludes, and we'll have the trees and the stars.

In the last five years, as I've offered this service in King George, Djibouti, Franklin, and now Chesapeake, I've never included the recommended use of memory stars. As written, the service calls for bare trees to be put at the back of the sanctuary and for stars made out of paper to be handed to worshippers as they come in. At one point in the service, the congregation is invited to write their concerns for themselves and for others on the stars and to hang them on the trees.

Again as written, the service recommends that the trees be 10- to 12-foot limbs put into pots. We'll adapt that. I found tree-like construction paper on Amazon and will post that around the sanctuary. We'll also use Post-it stars to eliminate the need for ornament hookers. There may be some other variations with the service involving candles but that remains to be seen.

Please plan to be part of the Blue Christmas service Saturday, Dec. 21, at 4 p.m. The worship committee decided to offer the service last year to help us remember congregants who died during the COVID pandemic and whose lives could not be celebrated because of pandemic restrictions. Baylake UMC, my home church, has had the service for years and I remember getting a postcard about it after my father's death. The service is designed to help those who find the holidays difficult to celebrate. Please share word of this service with your friends and please keep its preparations in your prayers.
