I'm waiting to hear from a few people before writing more about apportionments. I'm waiting to hear from Joel Coleman, camp director at Occohannock on the Bay, and from Julie Kissell, who's president of the Wesley Community Center in Portsmouth in addition to serving as district president for United Women in Faith. Eastern Shore clergy met at Camp Occohannock several times while I was serving Cheriton and Travis Chapel; some of us even spent the night there once. I see great things about Camp Occohannock on Facebook and just learned of their adopt-the-counselor program for summer 2025. I'll let you know more when I hear from Joel.

I see in Oaklette's district apportionments that we've been asked to support Camp Occohannock with \$336 this year and asked to support the Wesley Center with \$132. Again, I'll share more when I hear from Julie and Joel.

In the meantime, I'd like to share something that occurred to me this morning, and that's this: "A disciple of Jesus Christ is a lifelong learner who influences others to serve." This vision came from Bishop Sharma Lewis at Annual Conference in 2017. At that time, Bishop Lewis gave us this challenge: "All United Methodist Churches in Virginia will have a process of intentionally forming

disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world by your influence and your acts of servanthood by 2020." Unfortunately, this challenge got swept away by COVID. Still, I appreciate Bishop Lewis' leadership and emphasis on making disciples.

I hope that the seven of us who attend [Re]thinking Church Culture training at Oak Grove UMC Saturday learn more about leadership and discipleship. [Re]think coordinator Jordi Shelton said in an email Tuesday,

"We will be discussing your church's unique identity and culture, which encompasses not only worship/your worship style, but also into your engagement with your community in and out of church.

"We'll have opportunities to evaluate what your church is currently doing well, where growth is possible, and ways to use your values to create attainable goals that create positive change. This positive change is not only limited to worship services – it could include things like programming, education, hospitality, or outreach."

That sounds good, doesn't it? I look forward to sharing more, and I'm happy to be in mission with you.
