Defining where we live certainly affects our attitude. Followers of Jesus, or saints, consider their true home to be in God’s dynamic presence. St. Paul was so connected to God through prayer that mystical experiences left him not knowing whether he was in or out of his body (see 2 Corinthians 12:1-10).
