I'm optimistic about the future of the church. My sense of optimism has been growing and was bolstered by the Level Up workshop I joined online last weekend. As I've said since, I was particularly struck by the last breakout session led Saturday morning by Roger Ross of Spiritual Leadership, Inc. Ross is a former Director of Congregational Excellence in the Missouri Conference and former pastor First UMC in Spring, Ill., that state's largest UM congregation.

Ross based much of teaching on *Anatomy of a Revived Church*, a slim volume from Thom Rainer that I got from Amazon this morning. Rainer is the author and co-author of several books including *Autopsy of a Deceased Church*, which I read while serving Epworth.

I look forward to reading *Anatomy* as an antidote to *Autopsy*. I picked up quickly on some common themes – i.e., churches that are inward-looking are those most at risk of closing. As Ross noted in his class Saturday, churches begin to fail when we focus more on our traditions than on our mission.

The chapters of Rainer's newer book are labelled "Anatomy Findings," and the findings include "Accepting Responsibility," "Overcoming the Traps of Traditions," and "Committing to Powerful Prayer." I look forward to sharing more with you in the weeks to come. I'm going to ask the committee on nominations and leadership development to explore what Ross and Rainer say. That committee has a reputation for only handling nominations, but the *Book of Discipline*'s explanation of the committee's work says that it has a greater scope, including advising the church council on ministry in the local context. That sounds like a good place for a healthy dose of optimism.
