Dear Elizabeth River District Friends,

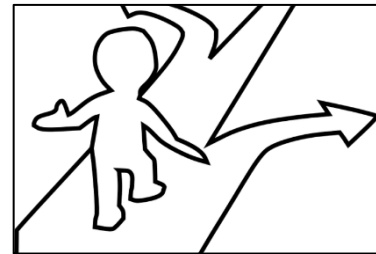
Grace and peace to you as we enter into this New Year and decade!

It dawns on me that the words grace and peace are particularly timely on this first week. All of us have reentered our work together with the arrival of "*Protocol of Reconciliation & Grace Through Separation*". We are all struggling a bit with our response because nearly all of us, including myself, received word about it through national news sources. So many of you worked very hard to address the issue with pastoral sensitivity from your pulpits this weekend and I am grateful for your initiative in beginning our conversation.

The Elizabeth River District desires to do the very best we can to provide you resources to assist you in continuing your leadership around this issue in the weeks and months to come. Unfortunately, as has been the case in the past, we are trying to get our hands and minds around a sometimes elusive and moving target. Let me therefore offer a few thoughts, reminders, and resources that I pray might be a part of our continuing response:

1. Let me remind you that the Protocol is not yet a done deal. It has been approved by sixteen persons and still has to pass a number of substantial bars including Judicial Council and General Conference. Many things can happen between now and May.
2. That being said, let us also recognize that this proposal does have stronger legs than most others that have come before us. It has the endorsement of multiple critical representatives that exercise substantial denominational weight. There is a reasonable chance of approval.
3. As we have said many times before, disciples of Jesus Christ are self-feeders. That means that we don't wait for others to take the initiative in our learning. We take initiative whether we are clergy or lay. During contentious seasons such as ours, it is critical that we do all we can to take the volume down, listen carefully, and learn. Best decisions are made in this place.

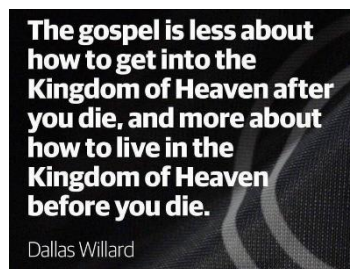

4. As has been said many times, your non-anxious leadership matters. We must be careful in our conversations. We don't speak in sound bites. We don't use bumper sticker slogans. We don't react, but instead, we respond. We deliberately choose to love all those around us, even in disagreement. We choose to serve and wash the feet even of those who disagree with us. That is just what we as clergy and lay leadership do, but we do so following the example of our Lord.

Finally, and most importantly, many have been praying. Clergy and laity both have been praying for renewal to fall upon our local churches, Districts, Annual Conferences and for our 2020 General Conference. Most of all we prayed for renewal of your church and mine. Those prayers have been heard by our loving God who yearns for those prayers. God is not done with us yet and as has been said many times from this office, in Jesus Christ there is no place where there is no hope. I join you in holding on to that hope and the Savior who yet offers it to us individually, congregationally, and denominationally!

TIM TALK "Kingdom Living"

Recently in the office Edna came to me with a computer question. She apparently was having problems in printing a payroll tax document using e-forms. Thinking it had something to do with her new computer she came to me for help. I walked to her computer, sat down, and began to look at her computer screen. On the screen there was a blue box that said: "Print and Save Document." I asked her if she had clicked her mouse onto the blue box. Her answer was "I don't recall...go ahead and click it for me." So, I did. And, if by magic, the document printed!

Often times, when it comes to reading the Bible many of us do the same thing; we fail to follow its basic instruction. Many people read the Bible as though it were Basic Instruction Before Leaving Earth. As long as they follow its instructions the Bible becomes their lottery ticket guaranteeing them space in heaven. However, Kingdom living isn't about getting to heaven as much as it's about how one lives out their life in the here and now. Steven Koster, Executive Editor of Today Devotional and Director of ReFrame Media says of the word kingdom; *"it is used many times in the New Testament gospels. Jesus often said, 'The kingdom of heaven is like...' and then he went on to tell a parable describing what it was like. It's like a man who sows seed, or a mustard seed, or a treasure hidden in a field. Those are just a few examples. But*

what does that mean? A definition I learned many years ago as a child was, 'The kingdom of God is the rule of God in the hearts and lives of his subjects.' And it was often illustrated by means of a heart, with a throne pictured in the middle of the heart. It's what the world looks like when people love God and neighbor as they were designed to do."

Like the little blue box on Edna's computer, many of us read the Bible without following through with its basic instruction for Kingdom Living in the here and now. Preparing for life in heaven takes much more than just reading the Bible; it takes the willingness to press the 'Print and Save' button now and start loving God and neighbor as we were designed to do.

In the words of the Apostle Paul:

"Love from the center of who you are. Don't Fake It!" (Romans 12:9)

SHEPHERD'S CROOK

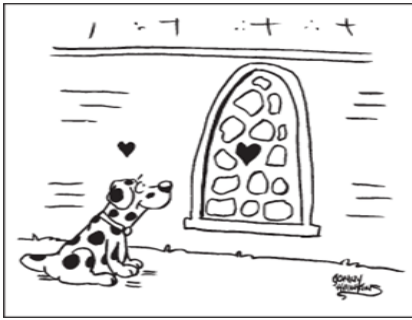

January 15-21, 2020

Our 26th Year!

Year 26 is in the books!

We took 44+ guests per night. 70 individuals stayed with us at least one night. We were partnered with Christ United Methodist Church which was also a busing site. The number of homeless this year averaged 100+.

Again, this year, we were blessed to have the Students from VA Wesleyan University. They stayed 5 out of the 7 nights and worked all the jobs. I was happy to see Oaklette's younger adults be more involved; Cassie Weifert and Jacob Reed stayed overnight; Charles Owusu-Ansah went to the bus stop; Daniel Manu worked several shifts. Sarah Miles was my Apprentice/Lieutenant, "learning the ropes" and mirroring my efforts. She will be an excellent leader when I turn over the reins to her (in the future). One of the older volunteers from St. Matthews had the best adage regarding aging, said, "We've been around a while, some of our collection plates are tarnished".

Barbara Bennett made sure that delicious meals were served (300 dinners and 300 breakfasts) and that 300 lunches were packed. A Vietnamese Group served a delicious dinner as well as, Eastminster Presbyterian, Woodland Heights Baptist and St. Matthew's Catholic churches and Coast Guard and Chesapeake Sheriff's Department, along with our "Egg Lady"-Peggy Johnson, Oaklette circles and Sunday School classes prepared meals. Members of St. Matthews Catholic, St. Paul's UMC, Grace Lutheran and Woodland Heights Baptist volunteers provided manpower to fill needed positions (especially overnight). Lori Hazlett wins the "Towel Cleaning Award" for laundering the most loads of towels (5 out of 7 days).

This year, we had to call the Paramedics twice at our church and once at the bus stop.

A special "thank you" to the Bus Team, a.k.a., my "Posse" ; Chris Carroll, Colin Carroll, Dr. Tim Hazlett, Arte Jones, Jimmy Lee, David Miles and Sarah Miles. They battled the elements (rain, wind, cold) to help me get our guests back to church. Calvin Gallop and David Rippard provided cleanup each morning. Our guests enjoyed several nights of rousing bingo games managed by the "Bingo Queen", Brenda Swoope and "The Duke of Bingo", Mike Le. The winnings were gloves, sweatshirts and warm gear, pants, bus tickets, etc. Thanks to the generosity of some individuals, we were able to give every guest a \$5.00 McDonald's/Dollar Tree gift cards for 3 nights and on the last night, we gave everyone an HRT bus ticket.

David Rippard, Calvin Gallop and Len Carter were our Procurement guys (picking up milk, donuts, dropping off mats and blankets, etc.).

Our guests were very appreciative and told me that no other church treats them as well as we do.

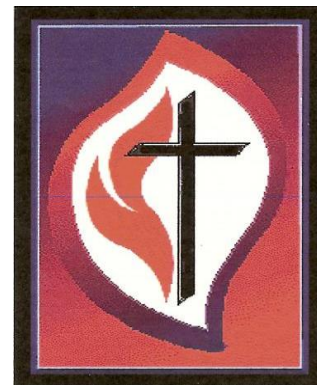
