

TIM TALK

“Open Hearts, Open Minds, Open Doors”

Nearly two months have passed since our denomination gathered in St. Louis for its special-called General Conference to decide a future course for the United Methodist Church concerning the church's stance on homosexuality. Like many of you, my heart was saddened that our denomination could not come to an understanding of what it means to live in unity as it ministers to all people. The denomination that was once known as the church with open hearts, open minds and open doors seems to have now slammed, not only its doors, but its hearts and minds to the LGBTQ community.

Of course, as I have shared with you from the pulpit; the decision of the General Conference does not, nor will not, bar me from welcoming all people into membership at Oaklette Church. Here at Oaklette we welcome all people to experience what it means to be a beloved child of God. Even though the General Conference may limit the definition of marriage (between one man and one woman) and the ordination of LGBTQ candidates; it does not, nor cannot, limit whom I welcome at our doors and into our worshipping community. If I were gay, I would truly find myself struggling to worship with a denomination that refuses to fully accept me into its life, however. My hope is that as we continue to reach out to all persons; regardless of race, gender, sexual preference, economic status, or whatever; we will do so because we love Christ. God's love, in spite of the amount of legislation we throw at it, cannot, nor will not be diminished! In fact, I believe it grows all the more.

Doug Forester, a colleague friend of mine, serving Reveille UMC in Richmond gave me his blessing to use what he wrote to his congregation back in March concerning the General Conference's vote: *"So, what does this mean for our life together? Reveille will continue to minister to LGBTQ persons, their families, and their children as we always have. Baptism, Holy Communion, membership, and leadership in our church remains open to these persons. There have never been prohibitions against such things in United Methodism. As is our mandate and practice, Reveille United Methodist Church will reach out to all our neighbors in love and service, and we will receive whoever God sends to us into this household of faith and lovingkindness."*

For some of you reading this, yesterday's decision is heartrending. For others, yesterday's decision was the correct one, and things are as they should be. Some of you have even wondered why this was a matter for conversation at all. As I said in last month's newsletter, I was, for several reasons, a supporter of the One Church Plan which would have offered our congregation more opportunities to be even more inclusive of LGBTQ persons. Yet regardless of where you stand on this issue, I want you to know that I love you, care for you, and will continue to give my life to

serving alongside you in this important work as I promised to do when I took my vows of ordination twenty-three years ago.

In John 17, Jesus prays for his disciples to be one as he and the Father are one. This is my prayer for our church in these difficult and divisive days. Regardless of where one stands on the issues before the General Conference this week, I believe that we can be united in the truth that our world stands in need of God's grace...

... I could go on, but let me say this: we are simply able to do more of God's kingdom work in the world when we are together, and it is my earnest prayer that you will join me in working for God's good in the world, even in the midst of things with which you cannot agree. Reveille United Methodist Church does not exist in this time and location by mere coincidence. God has placed us here for such a time as this, for making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. Come what may, to be the church Christ calls and the world needs, we need each other, side-by-side even in the midst of the areas in which we can respectfully disagree.

In other words, as I have said before, I love my people more than I love my positions, and on this day, I am asking you to do the same."

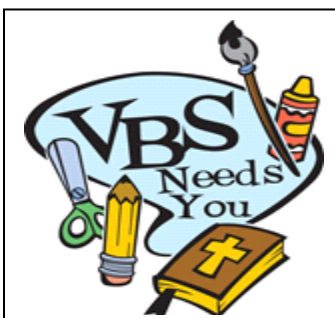

Regardless of where you are with the decision of General Conference, I am simply asking you to love all people. It's no different from the advice given to us from our Elizabeth River District Superintendent Wayne Snead; *"we need to put a premium on love."* May we put aside our differences and let the love of Christ flow through us as we here at Oaklette keep our hearts, our doors and our minds open to all whom God sends into our midst.

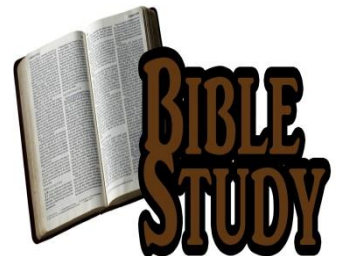
BREAKFAST AT DENNY'S

The Living Word

Many know of teacher Annie Sullivan helping young Helen Keller break through barriers of blindness and deafness to discover language: how Sullivan placed one of Helen's hands under running water, spelling *water* in sign language over and over into the other. In Keller's words: "Suddenly I felt a misty consciousness as of something forgotten – a thrill of returning thought; and somehow the mystery of language was revealed to me. I knew that w-a-t-e-r meant the wonderful cool something that was flowing over my hand. That living word awakened my soul, gave it light, hope, joy, set it free."

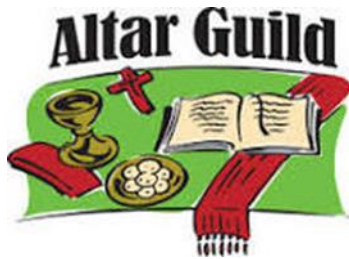

Today, April 1, 2019, is Census Awareness Day. The 2020 Census is quickly approaching. Soon, every household across the nation will receive a census form to complete and mail back to the Census Bureau. The U. S. Constitution requires that a census of the entire population be taken once every ten years. This mission is not to be taken lightly. The information collected from the census is very important for determining representation in the U.S. House of Representatives, as well as the distribution of over \$600 billion in federal funding. In Chesapeake, millions of dollars in federal and state funding are at stake, which includes funding that benefit schools, hospitals, roads, public works and other vital programs.

I am appealing to you as a leader within the faith community to help us get the word out about how important it is for every Chesapeake resident to participate in the 2020 Census. Below you will find a link to help you in this regard. I ask that you make announcements during your services in the months and weeks leading up to the 2020 Census and perhaps drop the information into your newsletters, bulletins and emails. <https://www.census.gov/programs-surveys/decennial-census/about/why.html>

Thank you for taking on this vital commitment and most of all thank you for the role that you play in meeting the needs of your neighbors and working in partnership with the City to improve the overall quality of life in our community. Ensuring that Chesapeake's residents are counted accurately and completely is one of the most important ways that we can collectively meet these objectives. A representative from the Chesapeake Planning Department will reach out to you as it gets closer to the 2020 Census to be a reminder and to assist you in any way.

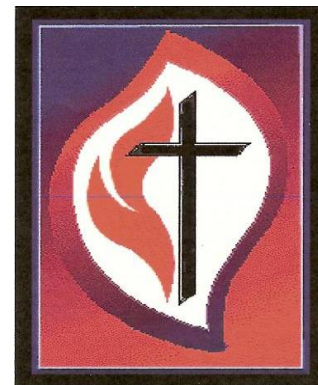
