Oaklette's committee on nominations and lay leadership development chose the Aug. 5 National Night Out as our outreach project for the third quarter of 2025. Community groups join law enforcement during National Night Out to promote a positive image of police and to show that police officers are approachable and friendly. I've attended National Night Out events in Franklin and Chesapeake and seen churches participate in both cities. Vicky Josue of the South Norfolk Civic League told me that Great Bridge Baptist has participated in National Night Out at Lakeside Park the last two years, and Dr. Bert Kirk, pastor of Indian River Baptist, told me that his church hosted a satellite event for National Night Out pre-COVID and said that Oaklette helped that evening by coming over and cooking on the grill.

Dr. Kirk added that police officers and firefighters were present at the event and said that community groups such as the Friends of Indian River participated, too. He also said that they borrowed some items for a street fair from a group of Baptist churches. I appreciated the picture he painted of a satellite site for National Night Out as the nominations team wondered about Oaklette's hosting such a site.

We discussed National Night Out at last week's church council meeting and voted to have a booth at the event in Lakeside Park this year and to consider acting as a satellite site next year. I asked Vicky Josue to let me know how Oaklette can register to participate Aug. 5 and will let you know what she says.

I checked my calendar for August 2023 and saw that hours for National Night Out then at Lakeside Park were 4-7 p.m. I'm not sure what the hours will be this year, and will share that, too. Please join me in praying for National Night Out and about we can continue to develop our relationships with Jesus Christ through service ministries.
